Identify strategies/factors which enable legal and behavioural changes. Collect good practice on what made changes possible. 4. Having a Civil Society (shadow) report to the Dublin Declaration Monitoring (part on stigma and discrimination). 5. Support/write/contribute to letters sent by the CSF tackling stigma/legal barriers/human rights violations of sexworkers, migrants/refugees, people who use drugs, PLHIV etc.
