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## Results from the 2020 Spring ETW

- Due to the ongoing global COVID-19 pandemic, the 15-22 May 2020 SETW primarily focused on virtual-based **SETW-related activities** with two key focus areas:
- 1. Sharing experiences from the HIV, viral hepatitis and sexually transmitted infection fields to work in unison against COVID-19;
- 2. Continuing to remind the European community that HIV, viral hepatitis and STI prevention, testing, care and support services are essential services and must continue to be supported, especially during times of crisis.

## **Objectives**

- Main objective: To assess the impact of COVID-19 on HIV, viral hepatitis and STI testing in the WHO European Region.
- Specific objectives:
- 1. Document the quantitative and structural impact on testing and, to a less detailed extent, on prevention and linkage to care for these infections among the different actors of the response (laboratories, clinics, primary health care units (PHC) and community);
- 2. Collect information on causes associated with this impact;
- 3. Collect information on measures put in place to mitigate it and areas where guidance or support are needed;
- 4. Document and disseminate good practices in service provision for the different infections in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic.
