

REGIONAL OFFICE FOR Europe

- Discussed and advised WHO on:
 - identification of key themes and principles that should be foremost in global health sector strategies for HIV, hepatis and STI 2022-2030 (with 2025 interim targets)
 - implications of the COVID-19 pandemic for WHO's work to address HIV, viral hepatitis and STIs;
 - maintaining appropriate disease-specific focus areas while also advancing universal health coverage and integrated approach
 - the challenge of reviving the global response to STIs
 - Is there a need for updating regional action plans?



Vision, Goal and Targets – 3 GHSS 2016-2021

Frameworks for action: Universal health coverage; the continuum of services; and, a public health approach



Strategy Implementation: Leadership, Partnership, Accountability, Monitoring & Evaluation

Pre-STAC civil society and community consultation feedback on four questions

During the 16 October discussion WHO was encouraged to:

- Highlight countries where progress is unacceptably slow
- Urgently prioritize key populations for all three disease areas
- Re-focus on prevention, including primary prevention
- Include HTLV1 as a sexually transmitted infection and strengthen focus on SRHR and HIV including for women living with HIV

- Guidelines on comprehensive HIV and hepatitis services for Key Populations
 - Person-centred broader healthcare focus, equal focus on HIV, hepatitis and STI
 - Modules by population, behavioural interventions, innovatives service delivery models
- STI guidelines
- Consolidated guidelines on ARV use for prevention and treatment of HIV os/infection *revision of 2016 & added recommendations per latest evidence
